## **TEAM COMPETITION**

The team competition is part of the 2<sup>nd</sup> IBSA World Games, but is not a qualifying tournament for the Athens 2004 Paralympics, since such event is not foreseen at the 2004 Games.

### **Male**

The teams are composed by a max. of 10 athletes (2 athletes in 5 weight classes) and a min. of 3 athletes (3 weight classes).

10 Teams participated, of which 7 from Europe, 2 from Asia and 1 from Panam .

The Gold medal was won by Russia.

The Silver medal was won by Japan.

The Bronze Medals were won by France and Ukraine.

### **Female**

The teams are composed by a max. of 6 athletes (2 athletes in 3 weight classes) and a min. of 2 athletes (2 weight classes).

7 Teams participated, of which 5 from Europe, 1 from Asia and 1 from Panam .

The Gold medal was won by Germany.

The Silver medal was won by Brazil.

The Bronze Medals were won by France and Russia.
